Mercy Care invites new volunteers to join our 100+ volunteers from Lake Placid, Saranac Lake, Tupper Lake and surrounding areas to help elder neighbors age in place more successfully. New Volunteers will help their elder neighbors stay connected to their communities and help to make their lives a little easier and happier.

Jerry Hayes, Mercy Care's Board President remarked, "The pandemic has only amplified the need some elders in our community have for the joy and companionship of a kind and compassionate Friendship Volunteer to help ease their isolation and loneliness."

The need for Mercy Care Friendship Volunteers is growing. Mercy Care recently received 23 new referrals within a two-week period for elders in need of Mercy Care's friendship and informal support assistance.

About half of Mercy Care's Volunteers are enjoying in-person visits with their elder friend, following Mercy Care protocols, adhering to CDC guidelines, and using PPE (masks and hand sanitizer). Other Mercy Care volunteers are being creative in visiting

their elder by telephone or helping them get their groceries, leaving a plant on their porch to know they are thought of, helping their elder friend read their mail, or sharing photographs via electronic devices.

Can you help?

Mercy Care receives requests for a Friendship Volunteer from elders themselves, their families, or friends.

Volunteers will learn about offering friendship and assistance to elders in sessions on healthy aging, spirituality and aging, community resources for elders, and COVID-19 precautions and protocols. New Volunteers will hear from experienced Mercy Care Friendship Volunteers who find purposeful service to their elder friends to be meaningful in their own lives.

Mercy Care invites anyone in the Tri-Lakes region or other surrounding areas who is interested in becoming a Mercy Care Friendship Volunteer to take the training in Lake Placid (if safe to do so) or virtually. Mercy Care is seeking to extend its Friendship Volunteer assistance program to the Au Sable Forks, Keene Valley, Keene, Wilmington, and Jay communities.

The mission of Mercy Care for the Adirondacks, sponsored by the Sisters of Mercy, is to extend mercy to elders living in the community in order to enhance the fullness of their lives and help them age in place more successfully.
